An unusual Pre-Imperial Beaker by possibly James Abbott of Gateshead 1795-1811 having an unusual capacity of 6.45fluid ounces. Excellent colour. Height 3 1/5”

Mid-18th century beaker by Robert Sadler of Newcastle-upon-Tyne c1734-78 (PS82) his single hallmark used as a touch inside the base. Attractively proportioned tall beaker of a form not previously seen, and therefore possibly unique. Very well made and nicely detailed with elegant banded foot, and incised lines below rim and at foot, with lovely turning lines under the base. Illustrated on the Database of the Pewter Society. In superb condition, with medium-grey original surface patina. 4" high, with 3" & 2⁵/₈" mouth and base diameters. Capacity 9½ fl oz.
